Parents of children in Year 3 and 4 who will have to make decisions in the next year or two may also find it useful to attend. Please be aware that applications do not have to be finalised until the end of October 2025.

However, parents wishing to apply for state funded selective secondary schools such as QE Boys and Henrietta Barnett, need to apply before the end of this term. Dates will be provided at the meeting.


