Well done Year 5 and 6 Mathematicians!

It is always great to celebrate the performance of New Enders.

During the Autumn Term, a group of New End mathematicians sat the Primary Maths Challenge. The PMC is an international competition run by the Mathematics Association. Children have to answer 25 problems over a period of 45 minutes. Results are then submitted.

This year, following their success in the first round, we were fortunate to have eleven children selected to compete in the Bonus Round this week. Congratulations to **Adnan, Ariel, Art, Ismail, Jan, Leo, Milla, Rose, Yusif, Xanthe** and **Zoe** for attempting this very challenging paper!

In addition, last week **Alana, Ismail, Rose** and **Yusif** represented New End at a borough competition. The Camden Maths Challenge saw twelve other schools compete at Rosary Primary School in a day full of mathematical challenges. The team performed really well, finishing in sixth place. Congratulations!

On Manday, **Alice, Clara, Fabian** and **Xanthe** represented New End at the Christ's Hospital School Maths Challenge at the Guildhall. The Year 5's worked in pairs to complete a range of challenges. Both pairs performed really well, finishing in joint fourth place from some 70 pairs. Congratulations!

Promoting British Values

In 2011, the government defined British Values as:

- democracy
- the rule of law
- individual liberty
- mutual respect
- tolerance of different faiths and beliefs.

We promote these values through our own school values, curriculum and enrichment activities.

The fifth and final value is tolerance of different faiths and beliefs.

We promote tolerance of different faiths and beliefs at New End by:

- Having high expectations about pupil conduct and this is reflected in our Behaviour Policy and Equality Policy.
- Ensuring tolerance of different faiths and beliefs is promoted through the Syllabus for Religious Education. Children learn about different religions, their beliefs, places of worship and festivals.
- Holding assemblies and class assemblies which also mark and celebrate significant religious festivals such as Christmas, Hannakah, Ramadan and Diwali.
- Visiting places of worship.
- Teaching children about the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child and learn to respect their rights and the rights of others.

Update on Supermarket Vouchers - A Message from Camden Council

Camden Council is changing the way they send eligible parents and carers supermarket vouchers. You will now receive them once a term (three times per year), instead of once every half term (six times per year). You will still receive the same amount of financial support, but the council hope that this change will give you more freedom in how you spend these vouchers. If you remain eligible, you can expect to receive the following:

- Spring term: February half-term and Easter holidays £45 per child
- Summer term: May half-term and summer holidays £60 per child
- Autumn term: October half-term and Christmas holidays £45 per child. If you have any questions, email MoneyAdvice@camden.gov.uk or call us on 020 7974 4444.

If you don't currently receive supermarket vouchers but you're struggling to afford the essentials:

- Apply for free school meals. If your child is eligible, they will get other support too including free breakfast clubs and supermarket vouchers. Apply at <u>Free school meals Camden Council</u> or call on 020 7974 4444
- Register for our free Money Advice Service at <u>Refer yourself for money advice and support</u> <u>Camden Council</u> and Camden Council help you access all the payments you're eligible for, including their Cost of Living Fund.

School gates open at 8.50am.


School starts at 8.55am.
