# Aquila - Andrew Norriss

This entertainingly written, prize-winning book is an exciting adventure. On a boring school trip, Tom and Geoff discover an ancient flying machine. Determined to find out more about it but also desperate to keep their find a secret, the boys return to the spot and, having mastered how to fly the thing, are soon off on incredible travels in a ship with strange powers including the ability to make them invisible. Along the way, they even have to learn some Latin for purposes of communication. Soundly based in a convincing everyday setting, Aquila is also a tightly plotted and well-imagined adventure. If you like this, you will certainly enjoy the sequel, Aquila 2, as well as another very different time-travelling adventure by Andrew Norris, Ctrl-Z.

#### Barkbelly - Cat Weatherill

An award-winning adventure story set in a beautifully realised world that's almost but not quite like our own. Brought up by loving human parents, Barkbelly is a little wooden boy who goes on the run after a tragic accident. The world he encounters is full of the unexpected including pirates, giant hedgehogs and life in the circus. Presenting poetry, magic, and dark twists of fate, this story discovers what can happen when your dreams come true, but not in the way you expect.

# The Battle of Bubble and Squeak - Philippa Pearce

The Sparrow children adore their new gerbils, Bubble and Squeak, but their mother detests them. A major family battle results, and it's clear life is never going to be quite the same again. But after a near fatal encounter between Bubble and Ginger the cat, Mrs Sparrow begins to see that life with a pair of gerbils might not be so bad after all. If you enjoy this award winning book, why not try *A Dog So Small*, also by the wonderful Philippa Pearce.

#### Bill's New Frock - Anne Fine

Bill Simpson wakes up one day to find he's a girl, and worse, his mother makes him wear a frilly pink dress to school. How on earth is he going to survive a whole day like this? Everything just seems to be different for girls. The bully whistles at him, instead of kicking him, he can't be picked to lift a table - not being a 'big strong boy' - his work's supposed to be ultra-neat and he's being cast as Lovely Rapunzel, who in any case never gets to say anything! Stylishly written by the former Children's Laureate and highly thought-provoking, this is a book that's not to be missed.

#### The Butterfly Lion - Michael Morpurgo

The inspiring magic of a white lion brings friendship and hope to a lonely ten year old in this inspiring story by the former Children's Laureate. Miserable at his boarding school, Bertie runs away. He is rescued by a kind old lady who tells him of how another Bertie, a little boy from a long time before, saved an orphaned lion cub in Africa. The symbol of the white lion becomes an emblem of hope as well as a link across generations.

# Charlotte's Web - E B White

A magical and timeless farmyard story which tells of the power of friendship. When the runty little piglet, Wilbur, is saved from an early death, he grows into a fine and handsome pig. And the farmer wants to kill him. Can Charlotte, the spider who has grown to love him, save his life? If you enjoy this classic story, you will probably also love *Stuart Little*, by the same author.

#### Charm School - Anne Fine

'I am NOT going to Charm School...' But Bonny has no choice. Forced to spend a day at Charm School while her mother is on a course, Bonny makes some surprising and hilarious discoveries. Can Bonny cope with listening to Mrs Opalene's Helpful Handy Hits (like 'how to bleach your elbows'!)? And what about the other girls - the awful, self-obsessed little princesses who really want to win the 'Glistering Tiara' and are prepared to do almost anything to get it? After Bonny's day there, Charm School will never be the same again...

# The Children of Green Knowe - Lucy M. Boston

Set in a beautiful and magical place, this is an award-winning classic story of a friendship that stretches across centuries as Tolly, newly arrived at Green Knowe, his great grandmother's old wonderfully atmospheric house, makes friends with Alexander, Toby and Linnet, his long distant relatives who lived in the house centuries before. Although from another time, Tolly's relatives are not ghosts; they and Tolly share a home and, through the stories of long-ago that Tolly's grandmother tells him, Tolly knows all about their lives while they can visit him in his. Together the children have wonderful adventures in the surrounding countryside. Further adventures set in the same house but now occupied by other children follow in *The River at Greene Knowe*.

#### A Dog Called Flow - Pippa Goodhart

This is a lovely, satisfying story about bravery and friendship which was shortlisted for the Smarties Prize. Oliver is finding it hard at school, and he longs for a dog. A dog could be a friend who didn't care whether or not he was good at school work. Oliver's parents say 'no' to a dog ... so Oliver gets his puppy in secret. Will he be allowed to keep Flow? Boy and dog are both tested at the local show, and then face a challenge on the fells that shows just what they're made of.

# A Dog Called Grk - Joshua Doder

A very different dog story from Pippa Goodhart's and the first in an excellent adventure series. When Tim finds a loveable little dog called Grk on his doorstep, he embarks on a mission to reunite him with his owners, who have been kidnapped and taken to their native Eastern Europe. His quest involves breaking into a high security prison, the hair-raising piloting of a helicopter, and a nail-biting race for the border. Other grk books include *Grk and the Pelotti Gang*, *Grk and the Hot Dog Trail* and finally *Grk Smells a Rat*.

# Down with the Dirty Danes! - Gillian Cross

A hilarious story, told in letter form, about King Alfred - he who burnt the cakes - and his battles with the Vikings. Berwin, son of Egfrith, writes to Wulfric, son of Elred, using his miraculous new talent of reading and writing. Berry's spellings leave a lot to be desired and in his hilarious letters he tells a tale of mixups and mayhem when King Alfred hides in his family's cottage but is mistaken for a Dirty Dane - their word for the Vikings. A completely new perspective on why and how those cakes got burned! Fast and very funny, from the prize-winning author of *The Demon Headmaster* and many other books.

# An Elephant in the Garden - Michael Morpurgo

Once again the amazing Michael Morpurgo weaves an intensely moving story about an extraordinary animal caught up in a very human war. It's World War Two in Germany, the animals in Dresden Zoo are to be killed because of the bombing but Elizabeth's mother, who works there, decides to save a young elephant and keep it in her garden. When her house is bombed she and her children and Marlene the elephant must escape the bombings and the Russians. An utterly compelling tale.

# Emil and the Detectives - Erich Kastner

A classic detective story told at a cracking pace, which has never been out of print since it was first published nearly 90 years ago. Emil is charming and clever, the ideal hero of this terrific adventure, and when he is robbed of his mother's hard earned savings from right out of his pocket as he is asleep on a train, he takes swift action. Emil has no confidence in the police and so recruits his own assistant, Gustav. The two boys round up a group of friends and set up a clever trap to catch the thief. Emil is handsomely rewarded and all ends happily.

#### The Fire Within - Chris d'Lacey

The first in an exciting, best-selling series and a magical book in every respect. 'David ran a hand through his mop of brown hair. Dragons. It was certainly different from his last set of lodgings, where all you got were spiders and the occasional mouse. "It's perfect," he said.' So the next morning, before breakfast, he has to go to the corner shop, and this is the hilarious and exciting story of why it takes him a very, very long time to get back.

#### Fudge: Tales of a Fourth Grade Nothing - Judy Blume

New pupils are made to sign their names in blood; the French teacher disappears every full moon; the assistant headmaster keeps something very chilling in his room...What's the meaning of the black rings everyone wears? Where do the other pupils vanish to at night? Most important of all, how on earth can David get away - alive?

# How to Train Your Dragon - Cressida Cowell

Then a terrifying monster arrives from outer space threatening the world with total destruction and the Iron Man fights him to the death, saving the planet and becoming a hero to all. If you enjoy this, you should also read for the sequel, *The Iron Woman*.

# I Was a Rat - Philip Pullman

Who is Roger? He says he was a rat - and some of the time he behaves like a rat. But he is also a small boy. Or, he could be the Monster of the sewers...Everyone has a view - including The Daily Scourge - which tells its own version in screaming newspaper headlines. There is just one person who really knows who Roger is. And she's the princess... Cleverly, award winning author Philip Pullman weaves together strands of story from different sources creating a fast-paced and multi-layered adventure.

# The Kingdom of Silk 1: The Naming of Tishkin Silk - Glenda Millard

This unique and tender novel is the first book in a multi-award-winning series by one of Australia's best-loved children's authors. Griffin Silk is from an uncommon sort of family, parents Ben and Annie Silk have a brood of five daughters ('the Rainbow Girls') and one son. In between helping Ma and Pa with chores, Laura and her sister Mary find time to climb trees, make paper dolls, and play with their baby sister, Carrie. Based on the real experiences of Laura Ingalls Wilder, who was born almost 150 years ago, *Little House in the Big Woods* is the first book in an award-winning series. You can follow the Ingalls family's adventures as they travel west across America and watch Laura and her sisters grow up in the other five *Little House* books.

# The Magician's Nephew - C. S. Lewis

#### Mr Stink - David Walliams

The second original, touching, twisted, and most of all hilarious novel for children written by David Walliams and beautifully illustrated by Quentin Blake. "Mr Stink stank. He also stunk. And if it was correct English to say he stinked, then he stinked as well..." It all starts when Chloe makes friends with Mr Stink, the local tramp. Yes, he smells a bit. #### My Brother is a Superhero - David Solomons

This is a multi-award-winning book - deservedly so! This is an excellent adventure story with real heart, that's also properly funny, with humour that comes from the characters as well as the situation. Luke is a comic-mad eleven-year old who shares a treehouse with his geeky older brother, Zack. Luke's only mistake is to go for a wee right at the wrong time. While he's gone, an alien gives his undeserving, never-read-a-comic-in-his-life brother superpowers and then tells him to save the universe. Luke is massively annoyed about this, but when Zack is kidnapped by his arch-nemesis, Luke and his friends have only five days to find him and save the world...

### Nicholas - Rene Goscinny

Written by the author of Asterix, Rene Goscinny, this is the first of the five Nicholas books which tell of the endearing exploits of the young French school boy and his friends. Nicholas has an engagingly positive outlook on life, loves school despite his academic failings, and has refined the art of driving his parents up the wall, while remaining blissfully unaware of how infuriating they find him. Goscinny and the equally brilliant illustrator Jean-Jacques Sempe have created a world of confusion that will make you laugh out loud These classic books are not only very entertaining, but offer a vivid description of French life and culture.

# Operation Gadgetman! - Malorie Blackman

Beans calls her dad 'Gadgetman' because of the weird and wonderful gadgets he comes up with - everything from exploding biscuits to Spy Kits. But when Gadgetman accidentally invents a device that could be used to steal millions of pounds, the wrong people find out and Gadgetman is kidnapped! Noble Warrior isn't the only one to prove what he's made of thanks to the support of those who believe in him; Charlie too finds the confidence to ignore her brothers' taunts about her thighs, and even persuades them to work as part of her team.

# The Sheep-Pig - Dick King-Smith

The magic of a special animal is perfectly captured in the heroic antics of Babe, a piglet with a difference. The runt of a litter, Babe is taken under the wing of the sheep dog and trained by her along with her own puppies. And Babe turns out to be a genius at it. His secret? Babe treats the sheep with courtesy and respect. A farmyard story with a difference, The Sheep-Pig is an exciting and unexpected adventure by an award-winning author and has been made into a highly successful film.

# Stig of the Dump - Clive King

When Barney falls down the cliff of the chalk pit he lands in what might be a rubbish dump. But the dump turns out to be the home of Stig, a cave-boy who turns what he finds to good use.
