Enrichment Opportunities at New End

New End is very fortunate to be able to offer our children a wide range of enrichment opportunities. This is a result of some very generous donations made by families and the continued support of NESA. The children really appreciate these opportunities!

Max Wainewright is our specialist Coding Teacher who works with children from Reception to Year 6. Max teaches the computing curriculum mainly through coding activities. This is a unique way of teaching the subject. New End children are working well above the required curriculum expectations in each year group.

Andrene de Silva is our specialist **Music Teacher** who works with children from Nursery to Year 6. Andrene delivers lessons to every class each week, focussing on all aspects of the music curriculum including singing, playing and performing.

Holly Marriott is our Wider Opportunities Recorder Teacher. Holly teaches recorder to both Year 4 classes. We also have Specialist Instrumental Teachers from Camden Music - Denise Georgiou (violin), Geri Peach (Piano and recorder), Jack Burnaby (piano) Steven Edwards (guitar), Steve Carlsberg (woodwind) and Ainsling Larkin (voice).

Keeley Kemble and **Treven Augustin** are our specialist **PE Coaches**. Every class has a weekly session with one of these coaches.

Gabrielle Morelli is our specialist **Chess Teacher** who works with children in Years Two and Three. Gabrielle is part of a team from Chess in Schools.

Ray Tudor and **Steve Buzzard** are our specialist **Cricket Coaches**. Children from Year Two to Five receive a half term's coaching whilst children in Year 6 receive a term's coaching.

Estelle Adier and **Sarah Rohde** are our specialist **French Teachers** who work with children from Nursery to Year 6. Both Estelle and Sarah are part of the team from Club Petit Pierrot.

Unlocking Potential at New End

Thanks to NESA's continued funding, we are delighted to be able to continue a partnership with UP – Unlocking Potential. Unlocking Potential is a charity based in London. They work collaboratively with communities to enable children and young people with social, emotional, and mental health needs to unlock their full potential.

As part of their work, the charity run a Schools Programme. The Schools Programme is a school based mental health service offering therapeutic interventions and wellbeing activities to primary and secondary age children. New End has access to a multi-disciplinary team, including Psychotherapists and Creative Arts Therapists. They provide flexible, timely and targeted interventions to improve emotional wellbeing and help children and families thrive.

Isobel McCallum is our school based therapy team manager, currently working three days a week. Isobel has worked at New End since February 2025 and is also a trained play therapist. She provides support for children across the school through such activities as "Speak Up", "Check Ins", "Six time talk time" and "Wellbeing groups". Speak Up allows the children to self refer for a 1:1 chat with Isobel if they have a worry or a problem. Check Ins can be organised by the school or parents, whilst Six time talk time is a short, focused intervention supporting children through a specific problem or challenging experience.

Aurore Blair, Sebastian Dreuneau and Elieni Sotiropoulou work as therapists at New End.

This term (and in Summer Term 2025) we also have **Hannah Mohamed** working at the school one day a week. Hannah is a trained Speech and Language Therapist and is providing input for small groups.

Isobel is in school every Monday - Wednesday at one of the school gates so look out for her and say hello. We will hold a Coffee with Karyn on <u>Wednesday</u>, 8th <u>October</u> at 9am so that any interested parents can hear about this exciting project at New End. We hope to see you there!

Instrumental Tuition at New End

Learning a musical instrument provides children with cognitive benefits, including improved memory, concentration, and abstract reasoning, which can lead to better academic performance. It also enhances motor skills, such as hand-eye coordination, and helps develop crucial life skills like discipline, patience, and responsibility. Furthermore, playing music offers an outlet for self-expression and creativity, boosts confidence, and provides opportunities for social connection and teamwork.

For these reasons, every child in Year 4 have a recorder lesson every week during the year. <u>These lessons are funded by NESA to whom we are very grateful.</u>

Spaces are now available for children who would like to start violin lessons with Denise Georgiou. Application forms are available from the school office.

Piano, woodwind, guitar and voice lessons are also offered at New End through Camden Music Service. If you are interested in any of these lessons, please contact https://camdenmusic.org/lessons-in-school/

Support can be provided to families who may find funding these lessons challenging.

DBS Checks - A Reminder

As part of our ongoing commitment to safeguarding, we ask parents and carers who wish to volunteer to support in school or accompany their child's class on a trip at any point during the academic year, to complete a DBS Check.

Please speak to Amanda in the school office who will be able to explain and start the process for you. It may take up to six weeks to approve, so please ensure that you leave adequate time to apply or you may not be able to attend a planned trip.

Anyone who has asked for a DBS check at the office, please remember that the email will come directly to your email from **Know My People**. Once you have completed the link attached to the email, please bring in the three **original** documents to the school office for verification.

Attendance in School

The government is continuing to emphasise the importance of regular school attendance. Chronic absenteeism, defined as missing 10% or more of school days, has been a significant issue, especially post-pandemic.

Every state school in England will continue to share their daily attendance registers across the education sector - including with the department for education, councils, and trusts in the next stage of the government's drive to reduce pupil absence in school. The sharing of daily school registers will form a new world-leading attendance data set that will help schools spot and support children displaying worrying trends of persistent absence or those in danger of becoming missing in education.

Parent fines for unauthorised absences are under a national framework to help tackle inconsistencies in their use. A fine to parents must be considered if a child misses 5 days of school for unauthorised absence. These 5 days may be in a series of five consecutive days or five days in total over the year. (For example, taking five days off without reason at the end or start of terms.) In Camden, unauthorised absences from school can result in a Penalty Notice fine of £80 per parent per child if paid within 21 days, rising to £160 if paid within 28 days, under the latest national framework. Failure to pay the fine may lead to court action, with a potential fine of up to £2,500 and/or a 3-month prison sentence, resulting in a criminal record.

Parents and carers are reminded that the school cannot authorize time away from school for holidays. In expectional circumstances, the school can grant exceptional leave but only if proof for the exceptional leave is required and your child's attendance for both this and last academic year was above 96%.
