Promoting British Values

In 2011, the government defined British Values as:

- democracy
- the rule of law
- individual liberty
- mutual respect
- tolerance of different faiths and beliefs.

We promote these values through our own school values, curriculum and enrichment activities.

The fourth is **mutual respect**.

- We have high expectations about pupil conduct and this is reflected in our Behaviour Policy and Equality Policy.
- Children are taught about the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child and learn to respect their rights and the rights of others.
- Through our school's values, SEAL scheme, PSHE and circle time children are taught to respect each other, to be cooperative and collaborative, be supportive and to look for similarities while being understanding of differences. The school is recognised as a Stonewall Champion.
- The SEAL theme of 'Getting on and Falling Out' explores these issues well.
- Mutual respect is also promoted through additional P4C and PSHE lessons and assemblies. A
 range of specific assemblies were delivered focusing on helping other pupils to understand
 specific special needs.
- Children are taught about the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child and learn to respect their rights and the rights of others.

School gates open at 8.50am.


School starts at 8.55am.

All items £1, or a voluntary donation; cash and card accepted.




Read-a-Thon
