#### **New End Curriculum and Key Skills**

The curriculum at New End is designed to provide a broad and balanced education that meets the needs of all pupils and gives them the skills, knowledge and understanding to prepare them for their future lives.

It ensures that academic success, creativity and problem solving, reliability, responsibility and resilience, as well as physical development, well-being and mental health are key elements that support the development of the whole child and promote a positive attitude to learning.

The curriculum celebrates the diversity of our community and utilises its skills, knowledge and cultural wealth while supporting the pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development under the umbrella of British Values.

#### **New End's Curriculum Statement**

At New End Primary School we offer a curriculum which is broad and balanced and which builds on the knowledge, understanding and skills of all children, whatever their starting points, as they progress through each Key Stage. The curriculum incorporates the statutory requirements of the National Curriculum 2014 and other experiences and opportunities which best meet the learning and developmental needs of the pupils in our school. The aim of our curriculum is for pupils to have the requisite skills to be successful, independent and motivated learners in readiness for their next stage of education. It is important that the curriculum considers the development of the whole child and not only concentrates on academic success.

Pupils are still working on the Early Learning Goals of the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum as they enter Year 1. There is a period in the Autumn Term where the majority of children progress to the National Curriculum. Throughout this period and beyond all children are still developing their phonic knowledge through the Letters and Sounds Programme and developing their fluency in reading through the daily supported reading practice.

The National Curriculum is delivered using a combination of discrete subjects and integrated topics and assessed against National Curriculum subject programmes of study as a basis to ensure coverage and progression throughout the school. The more able are challenged further in their learning and children who find aspects of their learning more difficult are appropriately supported so that they too are enabled to experience success. National requirements and school requirements are mapped out as a whole school and then individual year groups plan the curriculum for their pupils accordingly. The curriculum is underpinned by the school's core values of mutual respect, tolerance and fairness, and these are taught on their own and through other areas of the curriculum, including assemblies. The spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of our pupils and their understanding of the core values of our society are woven through the curriculum. As an accredited P4C school, we additionally offer structured philosophical enquiry to children of all ages.

This year we have also developed "New End's Key Skills" which we want to see our children develop from Nursery to Year 6. These key skills aim to develop independent enquirers, reflective learners, creative thinkers, self managers and team workers. They are written to show the progress over time from our youngest Nursery children to our older Year Six children.

### **Promoting British Values**

In 2011, the government defined British Values as:

- democracy
- the rule of law
- individual liberty
- mutual respect
- tolerance of different faiths and beliefs.

We promote these values through our own school values, curriculum and enrichment activities. Over the next five weeks we will be sharing how we promote each of these areas.

The first is **democracy**.

We promote democracy at New End by:

- having an elected School Council. This is used as an opportunity to promote and teach about democracy and the electoral process.
- encouraging volunteerism in and out of school. This includes things like standing for school council or house captains and also raising money for local and national charities.
- Promoting democracy through school elections and referendums.
- Promoting democracy through class voting for school council representatives and additional PSHE lessons and assemblies.
- Teaching children about the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child and encouraging them to respect their rights and the rights of others.

Attendance across the school last week is 95.56%, with an unauthorised absence level of 0.88%. Remember that good attendance is seen as 96% or better. Attendance to date this academic year is 95.20% with an unauthorised absence level of 0.34%.

**ABOVE** the Camden average of 94.8% and **IN LINE** the national average of 94.9% for the year to date. We need to keep this up as we strive to get attendance this year up to at least 96%!

School finishes on Friday, 16<sup>th</sup> December and ALL children are expected to be in until we close!

As always, if children are ill, they must remain at home. Please ensure that you contact the school office to explain any absence to ensure that it is authorised.

Nursery parents, please ensure you call the school office so the correct number of lunches are ordered.

There have been <u>18 lates</u> last week (3 less than last week!) involving <u>13 children</u> (2 less than last week) throughout the school.
