Fairer Funding Information

I understand that a few parents attended last night's meeting in Camden where the impact of the new Fairer Funding policy was discussed. As noted in Councillor Mason's letter last week, the impact from cuts would be great across Camden and impact largely on New End. With Camden schools potentially losing 5.2% of their funding, equating to £322 per pupil, this would mean a cut of **£142 002** to New End's budget in 2017-2018 based on our current number of 441 children. This would have a direct impact on staffing levels for the 2016-2017 academic year. Please continue to support Camden's campaign to stop these changes to funding.

Healthy Living Week

Thanks to everyone for getting involved in our Healthy Living Week to coincide with Sports Relief. Thanks to Julie Gage, our PE Leader, and staff for organising all the activities. Children and staff have been involved in the following:

Mindfulness Monday - Parents coffee morning with Adele O'Hanlon looking at promoting your child's emotional wellbeing. All classes had a focus on their emotional wellbeing with activities including relaxation, meditation etc.

Olympic Event Thursday - Children from Reception to Year Six are today taking part in fourteen different activity stations throughout the afternoon. We also have a 2012 Olympic torch for the children to see - special thanks to Clara, Percy and Arthur's family for letting us all have a closer look at one of these iconic items!

Move a Mile - All children have or will be moving a mile through the week in different ways. Nursery have been involved in a scooter-a-thon, Year One are walking, Years Two, Three and Four are dancing whilst children in Years Five and Six will be running a mile on the Heath tomorrow.

Children have also been doing fitness activities every day and many classes have been cooking as well. If you have yet to bring in your gold coin donation or sponsorship forms (some classes only) for taking part in activities, all of which will go towards Comic Relief.

Promoting British Values

As noted in previous newsletters, in 2011 the government defined British Values as **democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty, mutual respect and tolerance of different faiths and beliefs**. We promote these values through our own school values, curriculum and enrichment activities. Over the next five weeks we will be sharing how we promote each of these areas.






The final area is tolerance of different faiths and beliefs. We promote tolerance of different faiths and beliefs at New End by:



- We have high expectations about pupil conduct and this is reflected in our Behaviour Policy and Equality Policy.
- Tolerance of different faiths and beliefs is promoted through the Syllabus for Religious Education. Children learn about different religions, their beliefs, places of worship and festivals.
- This is supplemented by assemblies which also mark and celebrate significant religious festivals such as Christmas, Ramadan and Diwali.
- Visits are made to places of worship.
- Children are taught about the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child and learn to respect their rights and the rights of others.

Attendance across the school last week was **92.89%**, with an unauthorised absence level of **0.85%**. Attendance to date this year is **94.72%**, with an unauthorised absence level of **0.48%**.

There were **46** lates last week (**1 less than last week**), involving **37** children (**2 more than last week**) throughout the school.

REMEMBER...Children who are late miss valuable learning time and disrupt the learning of their peers and their teacher's teaching. With higher expectations now required for children to achieve end of year expectations, losing learning time has never had a greater impact!
